

Open Letter of Recommendation for John Hutchison, a Canadian Inventor

I am a Ph.D. experimental nuclear physicist and have been for 30 years. My bachelor's degree in physics was earned with honors in 1975, and I was awarded the Ph.D. degree in December of 1980 at the University of Maryland.

My background includes being a Staff Scientist at the Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory and a faculty member in the Physics Department at the University of South Dakota. Previously, I served as an instructor at the National Security Agency.

Regarding the contents of this letter, I would like to state that John Hutchison is a good man and a very gifted inventor. There can be no doubt that John would make an excellent citizen of the United States.
